

Drop off:


The school gates will open for pupils at **8:30am** and close at **8:45am**. Pupils should arrive between these times. Any pupils who arrive after 8:45am will be marked as late.


Please note that all gates will be opened for drop off, including Cuddesdon Way. Parents should drop at the gate as per the current arrangements, without coming on to the school site.



Pick up:

The school gates will be opened at **2:50pm** for parents to come on site for pick up at **3:00pm**. Please come to the following areas of the playground (see overleaf). Classes will then line up and pupils will be dismissed one by one. Please do not crowd the classes as they are being dismissed.





Pick-up: Clubs

If you are unable to collect your child and you are sending in another adult, please make sure they are on your collection list or call the school office to inform them of the name and give a password over to the office and to the person collecting.

If you are late then drop us a call, if you can and we will look after your child, please then collect from reception. *Please also refer to Uncollected Children Policy on the school website

Collection from After School Clubs

When collecting please make sure you collect your child from their clubs classroom from 4.15pm (unless stated otherwise).

Walking home alone: Pupils in Y5 and Y6 can walk home alone if they have parent/ carer permission. Please ring the school office to provide permission. Pupils in Y5/6 are not permitted to walk home younger siblings unaccompanied.

Pupils cannot be collected by older siblings if they are under the age of 16.

Communication

For communication with the class teacher, the preferred method is email or call initially. Your class teacher will share with you their email on the first day.

We share all information with parents via email, so make sure your details with us are correct.

On Fridays we send out the School Newsletter, which is also available on the school website.



Learning in Early Years

Pupils in nursery and reception follow a broad and balanced curriculum with input taken from the <u>development matters</u> which supports the delivery of the <u>Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) statutory framework</u>.

Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through 7 areas of learning and development. Pupils should mostly develop the 3 prime areas first.

These are: Communication and language; Physical development and Personal, social and emotional development.

Learning in Early Years

These prime areas are most essential for your child's healthy development and future learning.

As pupils grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas, these are: Literacy; Mathematics; Understanding the world and Expressive art and design.

These 7 areas are used to plan your child's learning activities. Children in the EYFS learn by playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.

Pupil Enrichment Programme

Every Wednesday afternoon at 1.30pm children in Key Stage 1 & 2 will experience an enrichment programme in Partnership with our new family at Radley College. The vision behind enrichment is about giving our pupils opportunities to learn new skills and experience different activities, to help develop their interests and aspirations; alongside meeting different pupils and develop new ways to learn.

The Programme:

Through the strong partnership with our new Radley family, your child will experience **3 different** enrichments offers from **3 categories**: Creative, Physical and Citizenship (community and wider world). Year groups will be placed within the categories and your child will need to make 1st choice, 2nd choice and 3rd choice.

We will endeavour to try and get your child's 1st choice but spaces are limited in the different workshops to provide a positive enriched experience.

Pupils will keep a personal profile to carry with them throughout their school career, to reflect on the learning that has taken place. At the end of each term you will receive the enrichment opportunities on offer for your child to select. Please spend time at home with your child discussing the options, so that the choice is the right one to develop new opportunities and skills.

Pupil Leadership Differentiating and Developing

As children move up through the school, they will have opportunities to take on greater responsibility, including leadership roles.

Including:

Student Ambassador; Well-being Representative; Play Leader; Librarian; Sports Leader, Playground Leader and Digital leader

In their *learning*, as children move through the school, they are supported to develop *greater independence*, encouraging them to challenge and extend themselves. In Year 4, children at have the opportunity to go on a *residential trip*. It is our wish that all children attend and we offer support to families who need it.

Lastly, **Year** 6 children are to wear a different colour tie, a privilege in keeping with their extra responsibilities and to show their maturity.

P.E. Games & Swimming

Here at **Orchard Meadow**, pupils will have the opportunity to develop a broad range of skills and learn how to apply them in different ways. The curriculum is designed to develop **fundamental movement skills** and give all pupils the knowledge and **cultural capital** they need to succeed in life.

Pupils will be challenged to achieve their **personal best** and see the best in everyone, whether in lesson or at competition. Physical Education will promote a love of learning through a **child centred** approach, shifting responsibility to our learners, with our key drivers at the very heart; **Respect, Determination, Creativity, Confidence, Enthusiasm** and **Ambition**.

The school currently offers two PE lessons per week and children in year 4, 5 and 6 will also have additional exposure to Swimming. **Swimming** is an activity that **benefits** virtually every area of your **child's** life but most importantly will provide them with the ability to remain safe in and around water.

In PE lesson, we follow a curriculum that can be found on the website.

In addition, children will have further opportunities to take part in additional sports sessions through our Enrichment programme and After School Clubs .



After School Clubs

Lead: Mr Beattie

Each term* we hope to be offering additional activities that can enrich your child's school experiences. At the beginning of each term we will advertise these clubs for you to sign your child up for.

The clubs will run for 6 weeks and we ask you to make a contribution of £10 for the course of the activities:, this will support the school with expenses (due to staffing, resources and other costs).

As a school, we will work to keep the costs to a minimum. If you feel that your child is unable to participate in a club due to financial restraints please contact the school to see whether you would be entitled for financial support (e.g. through pupil premium).

Home Learning - Virtual Y1-Y6

We have an expectation that all home learning is to be completed by our pupils.

Home learning is used to consolidate learning from the school day, support further learning opportunities and allow parents to discover areas their children finds difficult.

This will be set virtually with tasks set on Teams Classroom directly to pupils in Y2 and above. In Y1 pupils will be set work a little differently in line with their age.

Home learning will start after week 3 of the Autumn term.

Each pupil will receive at least 3 pieces of home learning a week: reading/literacy/maths. This will come out on a Thursday and needs to be completed by the Tuesday (most will be electronic answers). We will provide a homework book for working out to stay at home and any worksheets handed out and returned completed will be marked after 72 hours and feedback to your child.

Reading is crucial for children and we have an expectation that your child will read at least 3 times a week, recording all reading in their reading records, which we would like to be signed by an adult.

In addition to this your child will have take away wider curriculum home learning opportunities related to their learning of the term. This will be a range of learning opportunities that your child will select to accumulate points.

Home Learning for EYFS Children

Home Learning is equally as important for our youngest children but can often look very different to tasks set throughout the rest of the school...

Listening to and reading stories is crucial for your child's language development and learning and we therefore expect that your child is read to/reads everyday. Your child will bring home a reading record that we would like you to sign and write about the stories you have read together.

'Homework for Grown-ups' has been introduced to encourage parents and carers to watch and observe their children learn through play at home.

To form your child's 'EYFS Profile', we welcome evidence from all that know the child and therefore encourage parents to watch, photograph and write down what their child enjoys doing to inform learning in school. This will be done through an application called *Tapestry*. We will guide you through how to use this year- more information will follow to support you to set this up.

School Uniform

Uniform is really important for our pupils to have a sense of identity and belonging to a community. It enhances the appearance of pupils and therefore the reputation of the school. It also helps to instil in students a sense of purpose when they put on their uniform in the morning.

The only expectation for logo uniform is that your child wears an Orchard Meadow sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece top. There are no objections for the rest of the uniform to be purchased without a logo.

School Uniform

Footwear: All children should wear **black shoes or boots** during the school day; these can be trainer form but must be **plain black**. No coloured trainers/shoes to be worn during school day including coloured logos or trainers with 'light-up' features

A sweatshirt and tracksuit bottoms. Navy or black PLAIN may be worn in colder weather in the games lessons as these will be outside unless unreasonable weather.


Every term you will receive information about the stage your child is at. Holidays are not permitted in term time. Please see our Attendance Policy for more information.

Time Away during School Time

A brief summary of our policy

(Full explanation can be found in the policy on website or paper request from the office)

- Parents are requested not to book holidays during term time.
- You should only request time off in term time when there are **extremely exceptional circumstances**. We expect parents to take holidays during normal school holidays.
- You need to collect a **Holiday Request Form** from the school office, this needs to be returned for the attention of the Head teacher.
- Requests for absence for holidays during term time will only be considered if there are exceptional
 circumstances. Parents will be expected to explain these circumstances on the absence request form and
 support any application with documentation such as letters from employers or doctors notes. Issues such
 as parents' employment conditions related to non-negotiable holiday dates, the time of year and level of
 previous attendance may be taken into consideration.
- If the school refuses a request, but the child is still taken on holiday, the absence will be recorded as
 unauthorised and parents will receive a letter confirming this and warning that the parents may be liable
 for a Penalty Notice. If a second unauthorised absence is taken within 12 months, the matter can be
 referred to the Attendance and Engagement Service and may result in a Penalty Notice being issued
 without further warning.

We take pride in our menus which are all compliant with the expectations from the new School Food Standards. These are available in the newsletter and on our website.

Healthy Eating is key to your child's development and concentration at school. Studies have shown that children not only have improved attitudes to learning but develop key social skills whilst eating together. Children in Reception and Key stage 1 receive Universal Free School Meals*, so they will not need to pay for their lunches.

If you provide **pack lunches** for your child we expect parents to also meet the food standards and provide healthy choices. We request that crisps and chocolate is not present in pack lunches and that children have sugar free drinks.

To pay for school lunches this is done through the school office. If your child has allergies it is your responsibility to inform the kitchen at the school. We will provide milk as a choice for all pupils at lunch time.
