Vocabulary:

Blackbird Leys – Local area

Amenities – Useful feature or facility of a building or place.

Location – A particular place or position.

Fieldwork – Practical work conducted by researchers in a natural environment.

Compass – Shows direction.

Aerial photograph - Are taken from an aircraft or other flying object, so you can see land/areas from above.
