Expressive Arts and Design

- Listen to examples of African music with increased attention to sounds, instruments used and changes in tempo.
- Create own paintings, drawings and collage of African animals.
- Explore colour and colour-mixing.
- Draw with increasing complexity and detail.
- Create closed shapes with continuous lines.

Maths

Measure: make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.

Pattern:

- Notice and correct an error in a repeating pattern.
- Extend and create ABAB patterns stick, leaf, stick, leaf.

Number:

- Showing the right number of objects to match the numeral up to 5.
- Compare quantities using language: 'more than', 'fewer than'.
- Solve real world mathematical problems.
- Experiment with their own symbols and marks as well as numerals.
